Project overview

The Department of Education (DoE) is in the process of redeveloping Terrigal Public School to improve facilities and cater to the current and projected growth in the Central Coast LGA, as well as the broader Hunter region.

The project involves:

- removal of demountable teaching spaces to provide more continuous open outdoor play space
- provision of new future focused teaching spaces
- upgrade of some existing core facilities

The project is due for completion in 2021.

A Project Reference Group (PRG) was formed in October 2016 to commence the planning and design process. The PRG consists of members from the DoE, the school, and the P&C. Meetings have since been held monthly to ensure the proposed design considers the requirements of all users and meets education needs.

A preferred concept design has been developed and agreed upon by the PRG. The design meets all key drivers of the project brief and maximises the potential use of the site.

TAB 2 – Project update

The project has completed the concept design phase and the business case has now been approved by NSW Treasury.

All relevant site surveys and assessments have been carried out and will assist the project design team to develop the schematic design.

An Education Specialist has been engaged to develop the Education Model. The Education Model will consider the schools' pedagogy and assist the design team to further progress the schematic design.
