Technology Free Learning Ideas:



*Read a book

*Exercise together – running races, obstacle courses

*Science experiments



*Step- by- step drawing

*Cooking – following a recipe, measuring ingredients, learn about healthy foods and safe food preparation



*Grow flowers/vegetables in your garden. Record their growth using photos or graphs

*Play some games – cards, UNO, scrabble, monopoly, dominoes, chess, snakes and ladders (just to name a few favourites!)

*Jigsaw puzzles

*Learn how to make origami



*Get Crafty - Collect/sort/create using leaves, sticks, feathers, flowers, shells recycled materials such as bottle tops, keys, paper



*Investigate your family tree together

*Learn a musical instrument

*Build using Lego, blocks, magnetic blocks or recycled material (build a newspaper tower as tall as you can!)
