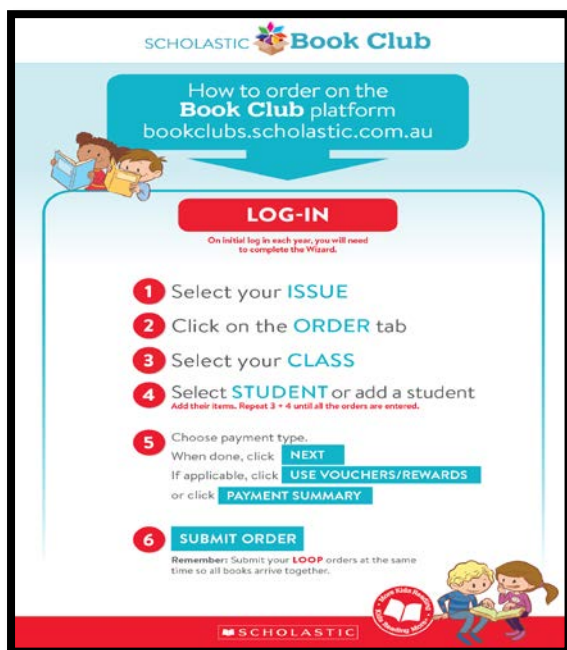

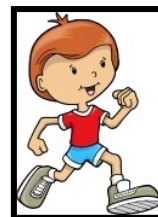

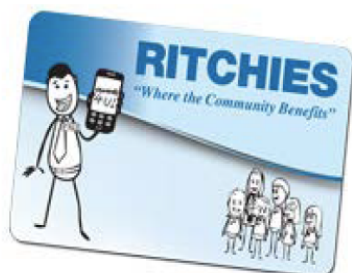

Pear Crumble

Season: Autumn/Winter

Serves: 30 tastes in the classroom
or 10 at home

Fresh from the garden: lemons, pears

This is an easy sweet dish that is great in winter. Once you understand how to make a crumble you can do this with any fruit that happens to be in season, and experiment with flavours – perhaps adding nutmeg or star anise – and textures.

Equipment:

metric measuring scales, jug, cups
and spoon
clean tea towel
chopping board
cook's knife
vegetable peeler
citrus juicer
large saucepan with lid
medium bowl
colander
large baking dish
wooden spoon
2 medium mixing bowls

Ingredients:

500 ml water
juice of a lemon
150 g caster sugar
12 pears, peeled and chopped
For the topping:
1/3 cup brown sugar
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp ground ginger or cinnamon
1/2 cup plain flour
2 cups rolled oats
60 g unsalted butter



What to do:

1. Preheat the oven to 220°C.
2. Prepare all of the ingredients based on the instructions in the ingredients list.
3. Place the water, lemon juice and caster sugar in the saucepan. Bring to a simmer.
4. Drop the pears into the syrup.
5. Put the lid on the saucepan. Turn the heat down to low, and simmer for 7–10 minutes, until tender.
6. Drain the poaching juice off into a bowl (you can use this for future dishes, just store, label and freeze it). Place the fruit in the bottom of the baking dish.
7. To make the topping, mix the sugar, baking powder and ground ginger or cinnamon together in a bowl.
8. In another bowl, add the flour and oats. Crumble the butter into the mix and use your fingers to squeeze the ingredients together and form pea-sized pieces.
9. Toss the flour mixture in with the sugar mixture.
10. Spread the topping over the fruit.
11. Bake for 30 minutes or until topping is golden brown and bubbling at the edges.

Leafy Salad: Master Recipe

Season: All

Serves: 30 tastes in the classroom
or 6 serves at home

Fresh from the garden: edible flowers, garlic, lemon, mixed salad leaves, mixed soft-leaved herbs

This recipe should be one of your basic recipes for frequent use. Vary the ingredients according to the season, including leaves and herbs of different shapes and colours, both bitter and sweet. Croutons (such as Turkish bread croutons) can be added. Students can decorate the salad with edible flowers from the garden, such as borage flowers, nasturtium flowers, even young flowers of chives.

Note: Make sure you wash and dry the salad leaves very gently, without bruising them.

Equipment:

clean tea towel
chopping board
cook's knife
citrus juicer
metric measuring cups and spoons
salad spinner
mortar and pestle
whisk
large bowl
tongs
salad bowls or platters

Ingredients:

For the dressing:

1 garlic clove, peeled and finely chopped
salt, to taste
juice of a lemon or
3 tsp red-wine vinegar
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup extra-virgin olive oil
freshly ground black pepper, to taste

For the salad:

4 cups mixed salad leaves, washed,
dried and torn (whatever is ready for
harvesting from the garden)
2 cups mixed small leaves and soft-
leaved herbs, washed, dried and torn
(e.g. rocket, beetroot leaves, baby
spinach, sorrel, mizuna, parsley)
croutons and edible flowers (optional)



What to do:

1. Prepare all of the ingredients based on the instructions in the ingredients list.
2. To make the classic vinaigrette dressing, place the garlic in the mortar with a pinch of salt, then pound it with the pestle until it becomes a paste.
3. Add the lemon juice to the mortar.
4. Stir in the olive oil and add some pepper, then whisk the dressing lightly to combine.
5. Tip the salad leaves and herbs into the bowl, add the dressing, then very gently turn them in the dressing with tongs or your hands.
6. Serve on platters and scatter with croutons or flower garnishes, if using.

- 2 cups milk

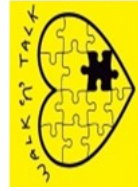

Parking Restrictions Outside Schools

KIDS LOOK TO US TO KEEP THEM SAFE - PARK LEGALLY IN SCHOOL ZONES

Central Coast Council would like to remind parents of parking restrictions outside your school. Please pay close attention to the signs outside your child's primary school and watch your speed when travelling through all school zones.

NO STOPPING zone

Stopping is NOT permitted at any time.

BUS ZONE

Stopping is not permitted during the times shown on the sign.



DOUBLE PARKING

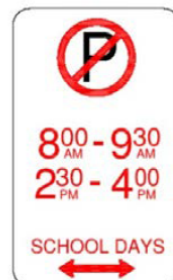
You are not permitted to stop OR park alongside another vehicle already parked parallel to the kerb. This means do not form a queue in the middle of the lane if you are waiting.

Move on, do a loop and come back.

NO PARKING zone

Drivers may drop off and pick up children during the times shown on the sign BUT note:

- Maximum stopping time is 2 MINUTES – your child must exit and enter the car within this time.
- Driver must remain within 3 METRES of the vehicle – you may get out to help with bags etc.
- Stop as close as possible to the top of the zone to allow access for vehicles following behind.



Stopping ON or ACROSS a driveway or other access point to and from a property is not permitted under any circumstance.

You must always consider the school's neighbours by leaving space at their driveways to allow safe exit and entry to the roadway.

Travelling more than 40 km/hour through school zones may inhibit a car from stopping in time to avoid hitting a pedestrian. Parking illegally also creates serious risks as it limits the vision of other drivers.

It only takes a split second for an accident to occur and only one car to present a danger to an unknowing child.

Please be aware of the restrictions and park safely outside your child's school.
