Welcome to Term 4 2019. Hasn't the year flown by. A special welcome to all of our new students. We have had 8 students start this week with a couple more due over the next few weeks.

This will be a big term. Along with all of the usual end of year events we will be working to be prepared for our move to the new building.

## Bandanna Day

Each morning next week Bandannas will be for sale outside the school office in preparation next Friday for Bandanna Day. Money raised from the Bandannas will go to CanTeen, a charity that supports young people and teens diagnosed with cancer.

Next Friday students will be allowed to wear their Bandannas all day (they will still need to wear their hats outside).

## Kinder Headstart

It only seems like yesterday that our current kinders started their schooling journey. Next Wednesday we welcome our 2020 kinders to our Headstart program.

We currently have more than 115 students on the books for Kindergarten 2020.

## Building Update

Our building is powering along. A great deal of work was undertaken over the school holidays.

This included:

- linking communications from the new building to the current school so that security, PA and computer network systems could be integrated.
- The front ramp railings were installed.
- Solar panels installed.
- Preparations to link the walkway roof to the library and the hall mezzanine.
- Roughing in of services on the second storey and many other tasks.

Some of the scaffolding has been removed revealing parts of the new building and over the next couple of weeks there will be a slow reveal as more and more scaffolding is removed as the external parts of the building are completed.

When we are in the new building there will be a number of new security procedures implemented. All school gates will be locked at 9.30am and reopened at 2.30pm. During these hours the only entry/exit to the school will be via the front office.

## Enrolment Policy

As I mentioned last term the Department of Education has revised its enrolment policy for schools. Under the policy schools have a set enrolment cap. If a school is over their enrolment cap they can't accept non-local enrolments except in exceptional circumstances.

Local enrolments will always be accepted.

Our school is well over the enrolment cap set by the Department. Therefore we are unable to accept non-local enrolments. This policy revision may impact families who were in our zone when they



enrolled their first child but have since moved outside our zone. With these families, when it comes time to enrol their next child, they need to talk to the school and complete a non-local enrolment so that the school enrolment panel – which includes senior school personnel and P & C representative – can consider their circumstances.

All people seeking enrolment will be asked to provide 100 points of evidence of their current address. Examples of the documents and their 'points value' are listed below.

## Bus Travel to School

Information about school bus travel is below.

### 2020 school travel applications now open

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply *if* they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have *not* been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.



If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.

## Intention to apply for Year 7 entry to a selective high school in 2021

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Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically high potential and gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates of their own academic standard. Selective schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, using specialised teaching methods and materials.

Selective high schools are unzoned so parents can apply regardless of where they live. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on **Thursday 12 March 2020**.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from late-September 2019 at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7>.

The application website opens at that link on **8 October 2019** and closes at **10pm on 11 November 2019**. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after 8 October 2019.

You must submit only **ONE** application for each student.

## 1. CALL 000

Make sure it is safe to approach:

- Check for any response from the victim
- Tilt the head back, lift the chin and check breathing
- If breathing is absent or not normal, CPR is needed
- Call 000 and follow their instructions
- If someone is there to help, ask them to call 000 for you, and fetch an AED if possible.



## 2. PUSH

- Place both hands in the centre of the chest
- Compress the chest to the rhythm of "Stayin' Alive"
- If you learned how to do it, provide 2 rescue breaths between every 30 compressions, otherwise push the chest continuously
- Push hard. Don't worry, you can't do any harm.



## 3. SHOCK

- If an AED arrives, switch it on immediately and follow the instructions.
