END OF YEAR SPEECH

Below is the transcript from my speech at presentation day for your information.

Good morning Terrigal it is Mr Burgess here with a slightly different Presentation Day speech (and a slightly different me!)

I too acknowledged that this ceremony takes place on land that is, was and always will be Aboriginal land. I pay my respect to elders past and present and extend my respect to all Aboriginal and Islander people with us today.

Well... 2020 turned out to be a little different to what we expected when we started the year. It was a busy time as we spent a lot of the summer holidays preparing our new building.

We put the finishing touches on our new classes and administration space. Had the P & C in for a sneak peak and moved in to our spectacular new building.

Teachers spent time planning and preparing for the new year. Interestingly I asked them to write a letter to themselves outlining their goals for 2020. That letter was sealed and it will be interesting for them when they open and re-read those letters next week.

We arrived at day one and students were welcomed into our new space, full of hope and wonder for the new year. Our new kindergarten students were welcomed by our student leaders and none of us could have imagined what a strange start they would have to school.

Learning began in classrooms across the school. Hands on mathematics, using technology such as Spheros to learn skills in problem solving, collaboration and innovation. Students learnt about themselves and others, read and responded to books and other texts, entered virtual worlds and learnt how to get along with other's in the real world.

They dug, snipped, fertilised, watered, recycled, composted and cooked. They learnt about looking after this world as we don't have a spare one. Students learnt to count, spell, write, argue, speak, listen, punctuate and multiply.

We even managed to fit in some of our regular events such as our leader induction. Our swimming carnival went ahead and students participated with enthusiasm and determination and cheered on their team mates.

Tim McCallum, a DoE big wig, visited because he had heard great things about our school. He was really impressed at what he saw.

A big term 1 event was having our demountables removed from the school oval to the relief of one and all. One of my highlights of the year has been watching students running on the oval at recess and lunchtime, particularly seeing more girls being active. The new building isn't just new learning spaces but the additional space it has given back to us.

We received a grant from Adam Crouch to do up our playground post demountables and we look forward to that project next year.

Then along came a little bug called COVID-19 and it changed the rest of the year. Our focus changed from learning to how best protect students, staff and the community. There were lots of new rules and restrictions. We stayed home if sick, tried not to touch our face (a really difficult thing for those of us with a beard!)

We washed and sanitised our hands over and over again.

We learnt what social distancing meant and how to practice it. It was a great maths exercise in estimating 1.5m

We scrambled to find supplies and the Department of Education sent us care packages with everything from soap to wipes and even yellow spray paint!

What was the go with toilet paper? Fortunately, our very smart office staff had stocked up early so we had plenty of paper to sustain us at school.

Some of our favourite events had to be postponed and then eventually cancelled.

And then everyone was out — learning from home became a thing. Teachers had to quickly shift what they were doing. They planned how to support learning at home. They learnt new skills such as delivering online learning. They also had some fun and if you haven't seen all of the videos it is worth another look if you are looking for things to do over the summer break.

It quickly became obvious that online learning wasn't working for many families. With parents working from home, siblings needing devices also and essential workers needing to go to work packs became the new norm. So each week 900 packs were ready for pick up our great community would come and grab their pack for the week. Eventually we got ahead and we were able to post out packs. Our community was amazing and followed all of the new procedures well.

Even our P & C re-invented themselves and went to online meetings, adjusted canteen and uniform processes and showed themselves to being an agile organisation.

Being conscious of our community the staff did coffee and food runs in support our local businesses.

The community was just as generous and provided lunch and coffees for staff to thank them for their work and support of students.

Just as suddenly we were back at school. Learning recommenced although many things couldn't go ahead as normal. Drop off and pick ups were different. Parents weren't allowed back in classrooms.

There was a real focus on making up for what was missed during the lockdown period. We also focused on reconnecting and rebuilding students and staff.

We couldn't meet in person so assemblies went to Zoom. Students watched in class as our leaders ran the assembly. We couldn't sing so one student sang the anthem at assembly on behalf of everyone else.

Our students showed their resilience and teachers worked hard to ensure learning was engaging and fun. The smiles returned and students achieved. In most classrooms learning was very similar to before COVID.

As restrictions eased we were able to do a few more things and managed to hold our athletics carnival although it was strange not to have families present – the empty stands reminded everyone that we weren't back to normal. Even the presentation of ribbons was different following the carnival with winners announced over Zoom and the ribbons presented remotely in classrooms.

The Minister for Education Sarah Mitchell called by to open our new building. Unfortunately, we could not involve everyone in a big celebration but managed a fabulous virtual ceremony including a video to show off our wonderful school and students.

In the continuing COVID gloom we had some fun. Students dressed up as their COVID heroes to acknowledge all that many had done to keep us safe. Be it doctors, our own family, nurses, teachers or just everyday heroes. We acknowledged their contribution and brightened our day also.

Despite the restrictions our school managed to do many of the things that make Terrigal a great school. We acknowledged and celebrated the rich cultural heritage of our Aboriginal community through NAIDOC week.

Our favourite teddies visited for a picnic.

Our teachers dressed up quite a few times as it has been a big year for them too and they needed something to spark them along.

There was a teachers vs students touch football game – boy wasn't that competitive! I think we called it a draw in the end but I think there are still a few teachers suffering the consequences.

Book week came and was a great celebration of literature and whole lot of fun. Thank you to everyone who bought a book from the book fair. Money raised is used to buy more books and resources for the library.

We held crazy hair day to raise money for Milton Public School, our bushfire buddy school. Milton was affected by the terrible bushfires back in January. We were buddied up with them to support them as they recover. We donated money to the school to be spent in the town. We also bought morning tea for the staff!

Speaking of hair, I had the pleasure of shaving a student's hair off – all in a good cause of course. Rohan had beaten cancer, then COVID hit but post COVID he wanted to help others with cancer and shaved his head to raise money. What a great example of what our school is all about. Well done Rohan.

We also raised money for children with diabetes, planted trees for tree day.

We snuck a bit more sport in with our basketball team being very successful at their gala day and our touch football teams showing off their skills in their section of their gala day.

We built on our focus on STEM science, technology, engineering and maths. We even had Adam Spencer visit to share his wisdom on numbers and maths.

Rumbalara environment team visited to build our environmental skills and we even saw some of the plastic we have recycled return in the form of two new recycled plastic tables and chairs for the playground.

We finished the year looking ahead with hope by welcoming our kindergarten students for 2021 into our Terrigal Treasures Headstart program. Hopefully they will have a more 'normal' year next year.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge some people:

Firstly, our debating team who have managed to argue their way through to the final of the NSW Premier's debating competition. I am prerecording this message so I don't know the final result but what ever it is, it is a huge achievement to out debate every other school in the state and get to the final. Well done.

To our parents thank you for your co-operation, support and resilience. You are amazing.

A special thank you to our P & C. Nicole and her team have done a great job this year to maintain the services they could and continue to support the school.

Our office and maintenance staff have been under additional pressure this year. The support they have provided to the school community has been amazing.

To our teachers and support staff you are legends! You have managed to be agile, flexible and learners. You have put aside your own fears and worries to support our school community and especially essential worker families. You have learnt many new skills and had some fun along the way. But you have always been focused on doing the best for students.

A special mention to Mr Lenson and Mrs Moore who leave us at the end of the year. They have been a great asset to our school and will be missed. We wish them well at their new schools in 2021.

My exec team is amazing. Thank you for the many, many additional hours you have put in this year. You are the best.

Finally, to our students CONGratulations. Whether you receive an award

today or not, you are all winners for surviving this year with a smile on your face.

I thought I'd share this one last image with you as a reminder that even though this year has been tough we always need to look for a positive. 
School Band






