Wellbeing Dog Program



At Terrigal Public School, we understand that students' social and emotional wellbeing is pivotal to their cognitive, emotional and behavioural engagement, which leads to effective learning and student success.

According to the *Australian Government: Australian Institute of Health and Wellbeing* website. <https://www.aihw.gov.au/reports/children-youth/australias-children/contents/health/children-mental-illness> , anxiety disorders were the second most common disorders among all children (6.9%), and the most common among girls (6.1%). These results are prior to Covid-19 and will surely be higher now.

Wellbeing dogs are an increasing strategy being implemented in school settings to support students' wellbeing. Research has shown that dogs can have a positive impact on students' emotional, cognitive, social, physical, environmental, academic and behavioural wellbeing. Students have a higher rate of achievement when they feel a sense of belonging and connectedness to the people and places around them. This is when they can really grow and reach their full potential. TPS has been doing research into the positive and negative impacts of having a wellbeing dog at our school. Our next step is to trial this strategy on a small scale within our school and evaluate it before we decide if it is suitable for our school.

School Dog Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Q) Will the dog be a distraction?

A) The dog should not be a distraction. It will be a working dog in school, there to promote the wellbeing of the entire school community.

Q) Is there a risk in bringing a dog into a school environment?

A) A thorough risk assessment has been carried out and strategies put in place to keep the students and the dog safe. Dogs are not allowed anywhere on the school site at any time unless specifically authorised by the Principal.

Q) Has a risk assessment been undertaken?

A) Yes, we have carefully considered having a dog in school and sought advice from many sources, including other schools that successfully have a school dog and a reputable dog behaviourist.

Q) Has the dog been trained?

A) Yes, the dog will be fully trained.

Q) How will the dog be toileted to ensure hygiene for all?

A) In the interest of health and hygiene our school dog will be toileted when taken out for short walks in the grounds. Only staff members will clear this away appropriately leaving no trace on the ground, cleaning the area with disinfectant, if needed. Our policy of no dogs in the playground is still applicable as we are unable to put effective control measures in place that guarantee temperament and safety when children come into unsupervised contact with unknown dogs.

Q) How will the dog's welfare be considered?

A) The dog will be walked regularly and given free time outside. The dog will have unlimited access to water and be fed regularly. She will have a designated house inside the school, at present in a Year 3 class and the school and the teacher responsible will ensure that this space is warm and comfortable for the dog. We will work carefully to ensure the dog's welfare is always considered.

Q) How will this be managed where children have allergies?

A) Children will not need to touch the dog, which will relieve the possibility of allergic reactions. We already manage a number of allergies at school and this will be no different for children and adults that are allergic to dogs. Individual needs will always be met and we are happy to work with parents to put additional control measures in place for individual allergies. The dog is groomed to reduce the possibility of allergens.

Q) My child is frightened of dogs. How will you manage this?

A) Access to the dog is carefully managed and supervised and children do not need to have close contact with the dog if they do not wish to. We hope to work closely with parents of children who are fearful of dogs to reduce their fear and to teach them how to manage this.

Year 6 Canberra Excursion-Rebate Information

Our Year 6 students have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government has contributed funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

** Please note that this amount had already been factored into the cost payable to the school for your child to attend the excursion.*

ADMINISTRATION CORNER

Refund Policy

Our school policy on refunds states that if your child is unable to attend due to illness or any other legitimate reason, the school can only refund money paid less funds already committed or spent. For example, in the case of larger excursions, venues and accommodation providers charge us on the numbers we provide in advance of the actual excursion. These venues hire staff, buy food, provide bedding, etc. Based on those numbers, the costs still exist even if a student does not attend. With bus companies we are still charged for a booked seat even if it is not used.

- The estimated time required to perform the role is approximately 1 hour per week




