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

Use of Closed-Circuit TV Cameras

Our school utilises a range of security strategies for the safety and security of students, families, staff and facilities. Closed-circuit television cameras are one of those strategies.

Our closed-circuit television surveillance cameras are located around the administration building and cover the Havenview entrance, the staff carpark, the area between administration and the canteen, and the area between the lower Kindergarten classrooms.

The surveillance is ongoing. Images are recorded to a server located on the school premises and cannot be accessed externally. Recorded footage may be provided to appropriate authorities as outlined below.

CCTV footage is collected for the purpose of:

- · Deterring the commission of unlawful activity on the school premises
- Investigating any allegation or reasonable suspicion of unlawful activity on school premises
- Taking criminal, civil or disciplinary action in relation to any allegation or reasonable suspicion of unlawful; activity on school premises
- Protecting the safety of other people on school premises, including parents, carers and members of the school community.


The CCTV footage is being collected at Terrigal Public School, Havenview Rd Terrigal NSW 2260. The footage will be held by the school or other unit of the Department of Education.

The footage may be disclosed to any person undertaking an investigation or taking civil or disciplinary action on behalf of the Department of Education, or to a court, in relation to any allegations of, or reasonable suspicion of unlawful activity on school premises.

The footage may be provided to the police or other enforcement agency for the purpose of investigating criminal behaviour, and prosecution.

Any individual whose personal information is included in any CCTV footage recorded at the school may apply for access to that footage.

ADMINISTRATION CORNER

A warm welcome back to all our families (new and old), we are looking forward to 2023 and all that is has to bring.

Bookpacks have been invoiced. We do accept the Service NSW Back to School vouchers.

- Vouchers are valid up until 30th June 2023.
- Each voucher can be used separately or multiple vouchers can be used in the same purchase.
- Each voucher can only be redeemed once. If the transaction is less than the total value of the voucher, the remaining balance is forfeited and cannot be used in another transaction, eg if the transaction is \$96.50 and two vouchers totalling \$100 are redeemed, the remaining \$3.50 is forfeited. Schools will receipt one transaction of \$50 redeeming one voucher and another transaction of \$46.50 for the second voucher.
- **No refunds** can be claimed for products redeemed with a voucher.
- You don't need to come into the office to have your voucher scanned. You can email a



How orders work

Here's a run down of how orders work in the canteen.

- Placing orders

You can place an order for recess and/or lunch in a couple of different ways. You can **order online** on Flexischools, or **over the counter** before school with either cash or an EFTPOS card. If you miss the cut off for Flexischools (9am on the morning you are placing the order for), you can ring us through the school and we will sort something out over the phone for you.

- Receiving orders

Recess and lunch orders are picked up by the class lunch monitors. Lunch orders are picked up in the classes lunch tub. Hot items are placed in separate bags from cold items for lunch orders, and both bags will be in the lunch tub. For recess, the whole order is placed in the one bag.

- Following up

If something goes wrong, and the order has not been placed, or perhaps placed for another day, please tell your child to come to the canteen first. We will check our list of orders for the day, and see what has happened. If there is no order, we will get the child to go to the office where they will call a parent or caregiver to see what you would like us to do. This usually happens at lunch time, and we may be unable to cook extra food at that time, however we can always make a sandwich or offer you other options.

We will always make sure no-one goes without food, and even if we're unable to contact you, we will provide a standard 'emergency' recess and/or lunch in good faith. We will let you know that we have done this and let you know how much it came to, by sending a note home in your child's bag.

If you ever have any questions, please feel free to contact us here in the canteen!

NAPLAN Information for parents and carers 2023

Why do students do NAPLAN?

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake.

As students progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy.

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It doesn't replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Schools have transitioned from paper-based to computer-based assessments. All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

Online NAPLAN tests provide more precise results and are more engaging for students. One of the main benefits is tailored (or adaptive) testing, where the test presents questions which may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses.

Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway.

What does NAPLAN assess?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum.

Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics.

All government and non-government education authorities contribute to the development of NAPLAN test materials.

Participation in NAPLAN

NAPLAN is for everyone. ACARA supports inclusive testing so all students have the opportunity to participate in the national assessment program.

Adjustments are available for students with disability who have diverse functional abilities and needs.

Schools should work with parents/carers and students to identify, on a case-by-case basis, reasonable adjustments required for individual students with disability to access NAPLAN. Adjustments should reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments.

To help inform these decisions, you may consult the NAPLAN public demonstration site, the Guide for schools to assist students with disability to access NAPLAN, or our series of videos where parents/carers, teachers and students share their experiences in using NAPLAN adjustments.

In exceptional circumstances, a student with a disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background, may be granted a formal exemption.

Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on adjustments for students with disability or the process required to gain a formal exemption.





What if my child is absent from school on NAPLAN days?

Where possible, schools may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

What if my school is closed on NAPLAN days?

Schools with compelling reasons may be given permission to schedule tests after the 9-day test window.

What can I do to support my child?

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some familiarisation and explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and quidance.

ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers.

NAPLAN timetable

The NAPLAN test window is 9 days. This is to accommodate schools that may have fewer devices.

The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 15 March and finishes on Monday 27 March 2023. Schools are advised to schedule the tests as soon as possible within the testing window, prioritising the first week.

How is my child's performance reported?

Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each assessment. This scale indicates whether the student is meeting expectations for the literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be provided by your child's school later in the year. If you do not receive a report, you should contact your child's school.

How are NAPLAN results used?

- Students and parents/carers may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to help identify students who need greater challenges or extra support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas of need to improve teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review the effectiveness of programs and support offered to schools.
- The community can see information about the performance of schools over time at myschool.edu.au.
