ClassDojo - How You Can Get In Touch With Your Class Teacher.

Teachers will communicate with parents through ClassDojo. Hopefully by now you have been connected to your child's class. Please contact the office if you require assistance. We acknowledge that some of our families do not have access or choose not to use technology. If you are unable to connect to ClassDojo, inform your child's teacher and they will make alternate arrangements with you. Here is some important information from our Terrigal Public School ClassDojo policy:

- Parents are encouraged to have their notifications switched on so they receive all information in a timely manner.
- Class teachers will check ClassDojo messages once per day Monday Friday between 8:00am and 4:00pm. In the event that a class teacher is absent, you may not receive a reply until they return to school. Teachers cannot respond to messages while teaching and may not respond immediately to messages sent.
- Parents need to contact the office for urgent messages, e.g. same day change in pick up arrangements. This will ensure that urgent messages reach the students in time.
- Images containing a student other than your own child may not be published or shared digitally in any way. This includes publishing or sharing on other social media apps.
- Communication must be respectful at all times.

Homework

Homework will be distributed each week and is to be returned for marking. Please ensure you provide your child with a covered homework book. Homework will also be posted on the class Google Classroom page if your child prefers to complete their homework online (therefore no homework book is required). At various times throughout the year, homework will be supplemented with class projects or other curriculum-based activities (eg: speech writing).

Absences

It is a mandatory state government requirement that all student absences are explained in writing. You can notify your child's teacher via Class Dojo, the school app or by writing a note. If you are planning a holiday or extended leave period, please contact the school office to obtain a leave form. It is imperative that you notify your child's teacher of an absence as soon as possible.

Resource Packs

Book and stationery packs have been distributed to students already. Please keep an eye out for the payment form so you can make a payment for your child's pack. It is every child's responsibility to ensure that they have the required equipment at school each day and replenish items when they are no longer in working order.

NAPLAN - Year 5 2023

Students in Year 5 will complete NAPLAN tests for writing, reading, conventions of language and mathematics. Students will undertake NAPLAN tests online between 15-27 March. More information will be provided closer to the date. If you have any questions about this please contact the school.

High School Enrolment Forms

These are being distributed to students later this month and should be returned as soon as possible. All students need to have this filled in, regardless of their chosen high school. You will notice that your child's designated local government school will already be recorded. This is based on your current residential address.

Money Collection

All payments of money are to be made to the office. Envelopes are provided in the office area and should be clearly marked with your child's name, class, the amount of money and what the payment is for. Money should be deposited in the box provided at the school office. Terrigal Public School encourages online payments through the school website. Please ensure permission notes for participation and receiving medical advice are filled in correctly.

<u>Hats</u>

School hats are part of our school uniform and the students are expected to wear a school hat in the playground and during outdoor activities in accordance with our 'Sun Safe' Policy.
